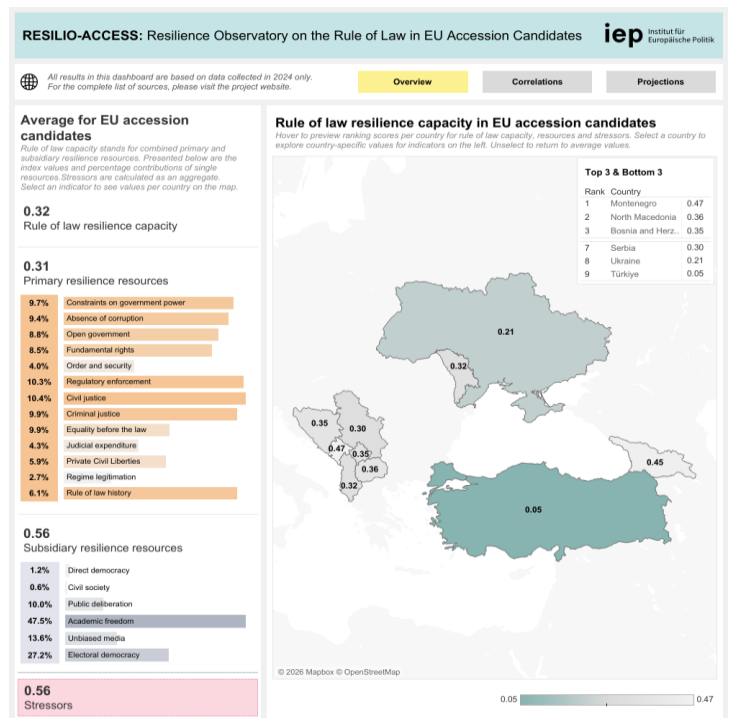
User manual

The RESILIO-ACCESS Monitor is an innovative analytical tool designed to assess the strength and adaptability of the rule of law in EU accession countries. The tool covers ten candidate countries: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia and Türkiye. 1. Overview

The map and variable panel on the left present scores for different dimensions for rule of law resilience: primary and subsidiary resources as well as stressors in selected countries and the overall rule of law capacity per country, representing the aggregated values for primary and subsidiary resources.

Rule of law capacity stands for combined primary and subsidiary resilience resources. Presented are the index values and percentage contributions of single resources. Stressors are calculated as an aggregate.

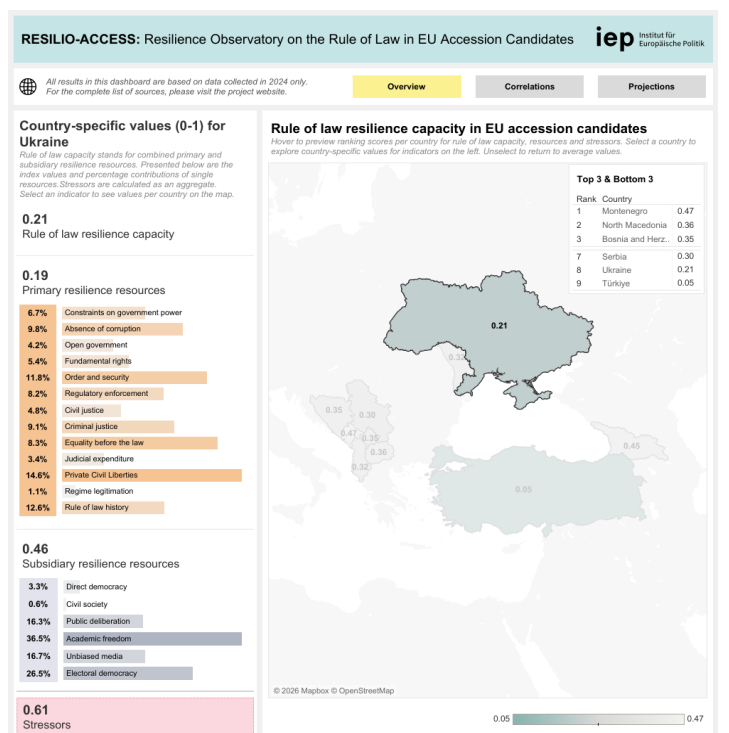


How to use it?

Select an indicator to see values per country on the map.

Select a country to explore country-specific values for indicators on the left.

Hover to preview ranking scores per country for rule of law capacity and performance. Unselect to return to average values.



2. Correlations

Scatter plots present the performance of rule of law resilience per country as correlations between resources, resilience capacity and stressors, including EU average for comparison.

Scatter plot 1 presents how a resilience type or overall resilience capacity correlates with the aggregated stressors.

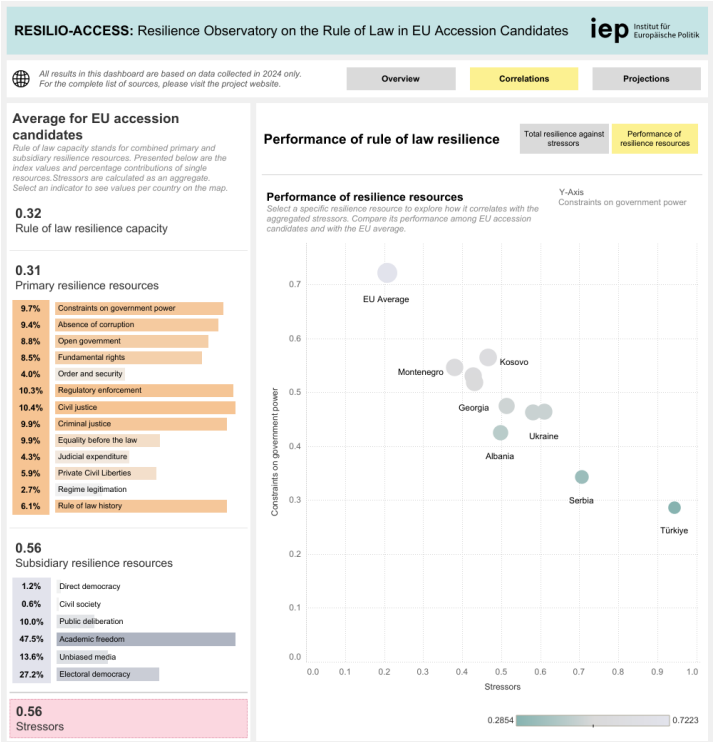
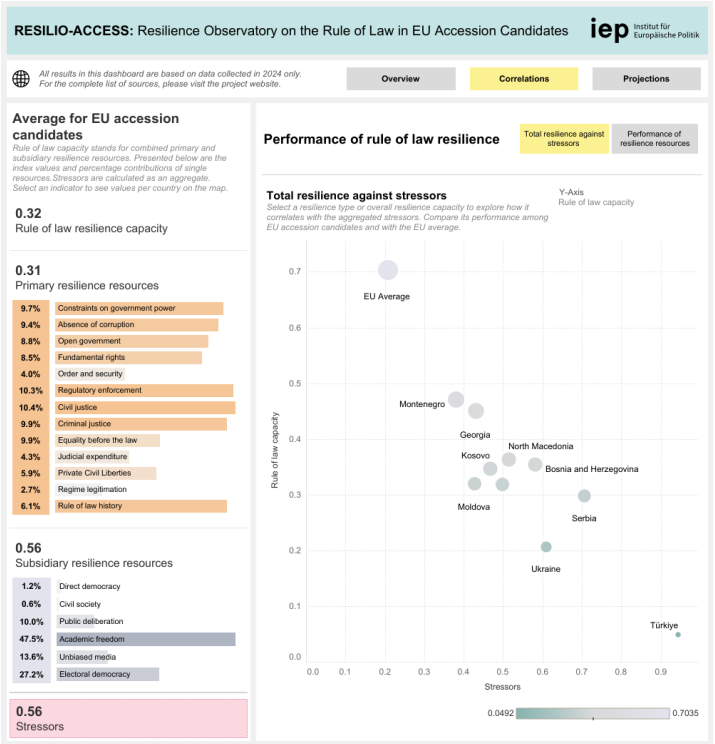
Scatter plot 2 presents how each specific resilience resource correlates with the aggregated stressors.

How to use it?

Select a resilience resource or rule of law capacity type to explore how it correlates with the aggregated stressors.

Compare the performance among EU accession candidates and with the EU average.

The values in the variable panel on the left will change accordingly after selecting a country on the graph.



3. Projections

Dumbbell plots present the potential change in overall rule of law resilience induced by improving rule of law resources (primary and subsidiary) in selected countries.

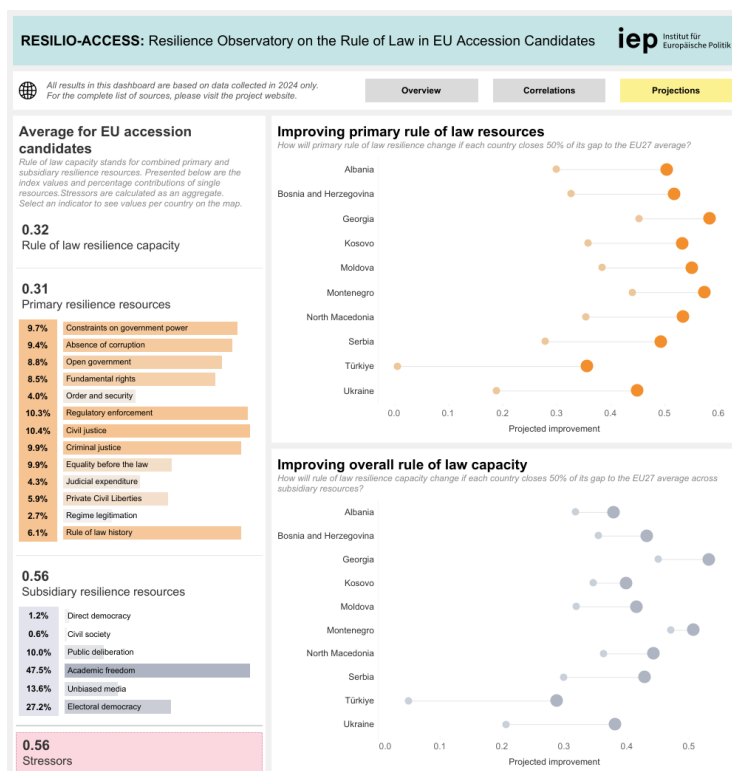
Dumbbell plot 1 presents the projected improvement of primary resilience if each country closes 50% of its gap to the EU27 average value across all primary resources

Dumbbell plot 1 presents the projected improvement of rule of law capacity if each country closes 50% of its gap to the EU27 average value across all subsidiary resources.

How to use it?

Hover to explore starting (current) and destination (projected) values on the graphs.

The values in the variable panel on the left will change accordingly after selecting a country on the graph
